










## **Folding instructions:**







- 1.Start by laying your square on a flat surface, coloured side on top and eyes facing up. Make your first fold from bottom to top.
- 2. Take only the top (it should be the open side) and fold it down. You will reveal the eyes!




3. Take the bottom and fold it up to the middle.



4. Unfold the square apart from the last fold.




5. Turn your paper so the white fold is on the left and fold from the bottom up. Unfold and turn around.




6. Fold from the top and the bottom to the middle you just marked.





7. Fold the outer corners on the right inwards.



8. This is tricky! Go into your corners and fold it inside-out, it should now look like this.



















9. Move the now loose triangular shape to the right and fold from left to right. It should now sit underneath the loose triangular fold.



10. Fold the nose in and bring the entire fold together by turning it around and folding in the middle.



11. Your guinea pig should now look like this!



12. Fold both ears up and to the side to make them floppy and fold the back of your guinea pig inwards to create a round shape.



Ta-daa! This is what your finished origami guinea should look like!
